This is a simple giving option that creates a way for you to support our work today while also providing for your financial security tomorrow.

How it Works

Donors age 55+ can make a gift in exchange for a gift of \$25,000 or more, Penn Medicine Princeton Health will provide guaranteed lifetime annuity payments. You designate **Princeton's Emergency Preparedness and Response Fund** to receive the *first three* years of payments. Thereafter, you or a loved one will receive annuity payments for life, and the balance in the annuity can support a *different* Penn Medicine Princeton Health priority of your choice.

Your support of **The Emergency Preparedness and Response Fund** will ensure that we are combatting the current pandemic, the residual effects this may have on our healthcare system, as well as any future emergent needs. This fund will help:

- Expand our diagnostic and testing capacity
- Secure Personal Protective Equipment
- Implement innovative and timely solutions to meet evolving needs
- Equip spaces with necessary treatment and monitoring equipment
- Expand tele-monitoring capabilities to enable off site clinicians to interact with bedside nurses and physicians to consult on patient care
- Provide financial assistance to hospital employees who are experiencing financial distress resulting from an outbreak with emergency childcare expenses, housing, or food
